Minnesota's Clean Water, Land, and Legacy Amendment supports a range of efforts in Minnesota.

The Amendment provides annual funding to:

- protect drinking water sources;
- protect, enhance, and restore wetlands, prairies, forests, and fish, game, and wildlife habitat;
- preserve arts and cultural heritage;
- support parks and trails; and,
- protect, enhance, and restore lakes, rivers, streams, and groundwater.

The Amendment's resources are dedicated to four funds:

- Outdoor Heritage Fund;
- Clean Water Fund;
- Parks and Trails Fund; and,
- Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund.

Each fund provides support through various programs and requests for proposals.
